Davis Advisors' Global Equity Composite includes all actual, fee-paying, discretionary Global investing style institutional accounts and mutual funds under management for each investment period from January 1, 2005, through the date of this report, including those accounts no longer managed. A minimum account size of \$3,500,000 has been established. Accounts below this minimum are deemed not to be representative of the Composite's intended strategy and as such are not included in the Composite. A time-weighted internal rate of

return formula is used to calculate performance for the accounts included in the Composite. For the net of advisory fees performance results, custodian fees are treated as cash withdrawals and advisory fees are treated as a reduction in market value. For mutual funds, the Composite uses the rate of return formula used by the open-end mutual funds calculated in accordance with the SEC guidelines adjusted to treat mutual fund expenses other than advisory fees as cash withdrawals; sales charges are not reflected.
